"Other nations have undertaken to intrude themselves into it, between us and the proper parties to the case, in a spirit of hostile interference against us, for the avowed object of thwarting our policy and hampering our power, limiting our greatness and checking the fulfillment of our manifest destiny to overspread the continent allotted by Providence for the free development of our yearly multiplying millions...." -John L. O'Sullivan, United States Magazine and Democratic Review, July 1845

This excerpt from *The Prairie and Overland Traveler* offers advice for organizing groups of immigrant to head west.

"After a particular route has been selected to make the journey across the plains... their first business should be to organize themselves into a company and elect a commander. The company should be of sufficient [size] to herd and guard animals, and for protection against [Native Americans]. From 50 to 70 men, properly armed and equipped, will be enough for these purposes."

This excerpt describes a Texas settlement in 1828.

"The Americans from the North, at least the great part of those I have seen, eat only salted meat, bread made by themselves out of corn meal, coffee, and homemade cheese. To these the greater part... add strong liquor, for they are in general, in my opinion, lazy people of vicious character. Some of them cultivate their small farms by planting corn; but this task they usually entrust to their... slaves, whom they treat with considerable harshness."
