- 1. Define:
- Total War: War on all aspects of the enemy's life. The systematic destruction of an entire land, not just the army.
- Resistance: An opposing force.

2. Union Strategy

- What river did the Union control which cut off the western Confederate states?
 - Mississippi River
- In Grant's plan, what city would he attack with his army?
 - Richmond, Virginia
- Where would Sherman attack with his army?
 - Across the deep south

3. The Wilderness Campaign

- Date: May 5, 1864
- Location: Dense woods known as the the Wilderness, in between Washington D.C. and Richmond
- North:
 - Grant, 100,000 troops
- South:
 - Lee, 60,000 troops

3. The Wilderness Campaign

- Lasted 2 days
- "A blind and bloody hunt to the death"
- What killed 200 wounded men during this time?
 - Brushfires
- Where were the next 2 battles fought?
 - Spotsylvania Courthouse and Cold Harbor
- Grant was called a "butcher" as he lost 50,000 men in 30 days.

4. The Petersburg Siege

- Why was the capture of Petersburg so important to the Union?
 - It would control the railways and cut off Richmond from the rest of the confederacy
- How long did it take to capture Petersburg?
 - 9 months

5. Sherman in Georgia

- Which major city did Sherman capture in Georgia?
 - Atlanta
- What date did Confederate general John Hood surrender?
 - September 1st






6. Farragut at Mobile Bay


- Who led a fleet of 18 ships into a channel to Mobile Bay, Alabama?

- Why was this an important battle for the union?
 - The last southern port east of the Mississippi was blocked



 - 13th amendment




8. The War's End
